For teachers actively involved in the performing arts, funds may be used for up to 50% of costs for: ♦ Purchase of instruments and music ♦ Support of drama, music, and dance projects. ♦ Attendance at performances or workshops. **Special Consideration will be given to applicants utilizing The Clark Center. All teacher applications must include a project budget. Grant maximum per teacher - \$1,500.**

For students actively involved in the performing arts, funds may be used for up to 50% of costs for: ♦ Purchase of instruments and lessons. ♦ Attendance at special clinics or summer programs in California. **Emphasis is given to individuals furthering their education or attending special summer programs or special clinics. Individual grants range from \$100 - \$500.**

- Total project amount needed
- Amount requested for Clark Center Grant
- Source for additional funds to complete the project
- Project Timeline

Priority will be given to those grant applicants who have not received funding in the past 2 grant cycles.
